CRITERIA

- Undergraduate Junior or Senior, Department of Art & Design Major
- Graduate Student in the Department of Art & Design

ETSU PARTNERSHIP

ETSU Department of Art & Design is in partnership with Penland School of Craft to support student growth outside the university through the Steele-Reese Foundation Scholarship.

SELECTION

A selection committee appointed by the Chair of the Department of Art & Design will award scholarships. Selection will be based on the quality of the combination of submitted materials. Preference will be given to undergraduate students actively pursuing an art education minor; however, sincere consideration will be given to all deserving undergraduate applicants who submit the required materials for application. If the undergraduate applicant pool is found to be unsatisfactory, the Penland Scholarship may be awarded to a graduate student.

DESCRIPTION

This scholarship provides one full scholarship for a two-week summer session to an art student with an interest in teaching. Penland School of Craft is in Penland, North Carolina. Students should not apply if they anticipate having difficulty attending an immersive two-week summer session on Penland's campus. Course selection will happen in January.

REQUIRED FOR APPLICATION

- Completed Art & Design Scholarship Application.
- Submit a 2-paragraph essay on why you want to take a class at Penland this summer. Include information on your interest in teaching art, if relevant.
- Name and office phone number of an Art & Design faculty member who will offer a verbal reference for this application.
- 10 Digital artwork images.
- Unofficial transcript.

SUBMISSION OF MATERIALS

Application materials must be submitted on OneDrive. Instructions are located on the Department of Art & Design Scholarship page on the ETSU website.
