CREATE is a clinical service and psychological research organization committed data-driven assessment and evaluation, empirically-supported mental health treatment, and the interface between science and practice. We provide comprehensive psychological, psychoeducational, and neuropsychological evaluations, consultation and training, and research and outcome evaluation to organizations and individuals. Our clientele is diverse, ranging from children with developmental concerns to adolescents and adults with serious substance abuse and/or mental health concernsExterns will receive extensive training and experience in the administration, scoring, and interpretation of many different psychological and neuropsychological tests, including cognitive, memory, learning, attention, sensorimotor, academic, socioemotional, personality, and diagnostic-specific tests. Typically, externs travel 1.5 to 2 days per week with our psychologists to various therapeutic programs in western North Carolina. Externs score psychological and neuropsychological tests and write reports from their personal offices, so that additional travel is not required. Case consultation and supervision are provided on site. Didactic trainings are held twice per month, which focus initially on administration and scoring of various instruments and then interpretation and diagnostic conceptualization. The Clinical Director at CReATE is also on staff at the UNC Chapel Hill TEACCH Autism Program, Asheville Center. TEACCH is a university-based system of community regional centers that offer a set of core services to meet the needs of individuals with Autism (ASD), their families, and professionals across the state of North Carolina. Externs are able to rotate at TEACCH and gain additional experience with Autism-specific assessments and treatment modalities.

Johnson City Family Medicine (JCFM) is a primary care clinic and one of three residency training programs operated by the ETSU Department of Family Medicine. Thus, it serves two functions: 1) to provide high quality primary care services to its patients and 2) to provide strong training in family practice to 18 residents annually. An important attribute of JCFM is that it has a long-standing tradition of interprofessional practice with an in-house psychologist, social health expert, pharmacist, nutritionist, and patient health managers. The practice strives to innovate around team based care and training students in these disciplines in that model so externs placed here benefit from that milieu.

Psychology externs who are placed at JCFM will primarily function as the Behavioral Health Consultant (BHC), providing generalist behavioral health care to all of the patients seen on the days they are on site. Generally, we strive to follow the Primary Care Behavioral Health model of practice with brief visits and limited follow-ups (two ½ hour follow-up visits per ½ day are allotted). It is not uncommon to visit with 4-6 patients over the course of a ½ day. Patients range from pediatric to geriatric. Most are low resourced. Presenting concerns are wide ranging with depression, anxiety, and substance abuse as top problems, though often those problems are ongoing in a list of 6-12 additional physical, mental health, and social health concerns. A secondary extern function is to provide training to residents, medical, and pharmacy students. There are many other program development and research opportunities at this site as well.

ETSU Pediatrics is a vibrant and busy interprofessional clinic serving patients 0-21 years of age. Team members at the clinic include representatives from medicine (pediatricians, medical residents, medical students), psychology, social work, nursing, nutrition and support staff. Supervisor is on site daily and provides live, individual, and group supervision via a developmental modelBy the end of the externship externs will gain competence in: Working as a behavioral health consultant in a fully integrated primary care model (e.g., brief 5-30 min sessions); communicating effectively as part of an interprofessional team; assessing and treating ADHD, general behavior problems, postpartum depression, sleep problems, enuresis, encopresis, habits/tics, anxiety, depression, PTSD, and others; conducting behavioral parent training; conducting suicide risk assessments and safety planning; modifying behavioral interventions for children and adolescents with developmental disabilities, including autism; working with local schools to coordinate and develop treatment plans for patients; and using and interpreting a wide range of behavioral screening instruments. During August-April, externs will spend 4-5 of their 20 hours per week as part of the Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disabilities program (http://vkc.mc.vanderbilt.edu/vkc/lend/), gaining expertise in assessing and treating a variety of childhood disabilities as well as completing a leadership curriculum. While not required, there are opportunities for research, program development/evaluation and assisting the supervisor in lecturing to third year medical students (as time and the extern's interest allows). Our clinic is a warm and supportive environment where extern training is a priority and psychology is valued.

The Alternative Community Corrections Program (ACCP) administered under First TN Human Resource Agency is a supervision and therapeutic probation program for non-violent felony offenders. These offenders are sentenced out of the Criminal Courts of the 1st Judicial District (Washington, Carter, Unicoi and Johnson Counties). Most of the clients sentenced to ACCP are dual diagnosis clients. Substance abuse and addiction are the most common problems and are usually associated with other mental health diagnoses such as depression, anxiety, PTSD, anti-social personality disorder, bipolar and/or borderline personality disorders, and narcissistic personality disorder. Clients are required to complete a stringent, 12-month supervision probation program as well as a treatment component with ACCP. Treatment consists of Moral Reconation Therapy groups, Pro-Social Lifeskills groups, Substance Abuse and Dependence groups, women's processing groups, and individual therapy. Often times we implement various other groups as needed such as parenting groups, PTSD groups, relapse groups, etc. The student therapist(s) are responsible for individual counseling, administration of various groups, attendance in treatment team meetings, administration and scoring of assessments, and the overall process of communicating with other ACCP staff in a collaborative effort to assess, design and offer the treatment plan and services necessary for individual clients' success. Assessments used are as follows: SASSI, ACE, DASS, TCU CJ CEST-Intake, BIDR, BSI, LSCM-I, TCUD, and O-Net Career Inventory.

In FY 2016 the clinic had over 7,000 encounters. The hours of operation are Monday-Friday 10:30-7:00 and Saturday 8-4:30. The setting is rural with high unemployment, low literacy, high chronic pain, substance abuse (methamphetamine), children of substance abusing mothers now are now school age, multi-generational families, and grandparents who are primary caregivers of grandchildren. There are high rates of depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, and schizophrenia. The area has limited resources for behavioral health services. The clinicians work in an integrated practice model. The practice is broad-based with the psychologist seeing both warm hand-offs and their own schedule of patients. In this practice, the student also learns to be an independent practitioner.

The James H. Quillen VAMC ("the Mountain Home VA") Psychology/Mental Health Service provides an advanced practicum placement, as well as an APA-accredited pre-doctoral internship. The facility employs 25 doctoral psychologists, each of whom has a primary assignment to a specific program, such as Primary Care, Homeless Veterans Program, Mental Health Clinic, Substance Use Disorders Program, Posttraumatic Stress Program, etc. Located on a park-like campus of more than 200 acres in Johnson City, Tennessee, Mountain Home is the primary medical and surgical teaching hospital for the Quillen College of Medicine. Physician residency training programs in surgery, medicine, family medicine and psychiatry are actively involved in health care delivery, as are ETSU training programs in nursing and other health care professions. The various clinical departments in the hospital have long track records of commitment to training and to the promotion of an atmosphere conducive to interdisciplinary exchange and development. Our VAMC is over a century old and has a rich history as a regional and national presence. The medical center won the Carey Award in 2013, meaning that we were identified as one of the top two VAMCs in the nation.
