
June 2023 Tennessee State Climate Summary

Monthly Temperature Summary:


June 2023 was cooler than normal for most of Tennessee, with the eastern half of the state averaging 2-4°F below the 1991-2020 30-year climate normals for June. Some areas in the mountains and northeast Tennessee were even cooler, with an average monthly temperature that was 4-6°F below normal. The western half of the state was also below normal, but closer to the normal range, with most areas averaging 0-2°F below normal. The month started and ended with warm periods, but the majority of the month had below normal temperatures. There were 9 broken and 2 tied daily low temperature records set at weather stations with at least a 30-year reporting history this month. Additionally, there were 43 broken and 12 tied daily records for coolest high temperatures set this month, including 14 at weather stations with at least a 100-year history. There was 1 monthly record for the coolest high temperature measured in June, at Rogersville with a high of only 62°F on June 8, beating the previous June record set in 1956 by 1-degree. On the warm side of the record books, there were no record high temperatures recorded this month, and only 1 broken and 2 tied daily records for warmest low temperature. The record warm low temperature was set at the Memphis International Airport, with a low of 81°F on June 30.



Monthly Precipitation Summary:

June continued the dry trend of the previous months for many areas of West Tennessee, with below normal precipitation for most areas week-to-week through June. The Memphis area was one exception to this, with heavy storms training through the southwestern corner of the state in the second and third weeks of the month. In the eastern half of the state, there were several areas, notably the northern Cumberland Plateau and southeast Tennessee, with above normal rainfall, with most of that coming in the second half of the month; however, there were some spotty areas of below normal precipitation as well. In the areas that did get above average rainfall for the month, most of that precipitation came in the form of heavy downpours, and there were 16 broken and 2 tied daily records for highest precipitation totals set this month across the state. Those records included three at weather stations with over a 100-year reporting history.

Due to the continuing dry conditions in the western half of the state, there were major increases in the amount of Abnormally Dry (D0) conditions in Tennessee on the U.S. Drought Monitor this month, and some areas of Moderate Drought (D1) were added to the state.


The Month in Comparison:


June 2023 was cooler than the average temperature of June over the past 30-years, with the eastern half of the state being cooler than the western half. The Bristol/Tri-Cities airport had its second coolest June of the past 30 years, coming in just 0.28°F warmer than 1997, it was also the 3rd coolest June for Knoxville, and 5th coolest June for Chattanooga in that time period. Looking at the longer-term climate record for these three cities, 2023 was tied for the 7th coolest June for the Tri-Cities, with a 76-year weather history, but Knoxville and Chattanooga did not have a top-ten coolest June, with the weather history for those cities going back 153 and 145 years, respectively. The airports recorded close to normal precipitation, with no station reporting a major outlier for June precipitation this year.
















Drought Monitor:

By the end of June over half of the state was shown with Abnormally Dry (D0) or Moderate Drought (D1) conditions on the U.S. Drought Monitor. Compared to May 30, D0/D1 coverage increased from 15.2% to 57.7% of the state (an increase of 42.5% of the state's area). Moderate Drought (D1) increased from 0% on May 30 to 11.15% on June 27. Most of the increase in drought conditions occurred in the western half of the state, with a few small areas of improved conditions (Abnormally Dry to clear) in the southwestern corner and northeastern portion of the state.



Soil Moisture:


On July 2, the USDA rated topsoil moisture as 6% very short, 23% short, 63% adequate, and 8% surplus. Subsoil moisture was rated as 7% very short, 21% short, 66% adequate, and 6% surplus. Most deficits were in the western half of the state where abnormally dry and drought conditions were present for most of the month.



Streamflow:

Streamflow showed mixed conditions across the state averaged for the month of June, this was due to the regional/spotty nature of heavy rainfall across the state during the month. The majority of stream gauges averaged in the normal range (25-75 percentile) for the month, with a few streams scattered across the state (mostly in the northern half) reporting below normal streamflow for the month. A few stream gauges in the eastern half of the state did report above normal streamflow for June.

Map of monthly streamflow compared to historical streamflow for the month of the year (Tennessee)




Miscellaneous:

Crop Conditions from USDA: Dry conditions in the first half of the month caused signs of stress in corn, soybean, and cotton crops across the state. Rains in parts of Middle and East Tennessee helped to improve conditions some in the middle of the month. Widespread rains in the last week of June helped to improve soil moisture and crop conditions across the state. The first cutting of hay was finished in most areas with mixed yields. Winter wheat harvest was underway, with 71% of the crop being harvested by the week ending June 25, and 84% of the crop reported in good or excellent condition, despite fears of damage done by the December 2022 extreme cold outbreak.




Fire Danger: The Interagency Fire Center shows that all of Tennessee and surrounding areas will have a normal potential for significant wildland fires in July.



Story of the Month:

Despite the cooler than normal conditions for June 2023, one of the major weather/climate stories of the month was the high heat and dangerous heat index values that impacted the state in the final days of the month. This heat wave stared earlier in the month in the south-central US and shifted eastward and began impacting Tennessee on June 29-30. Heat index values were forecasted to top 110°F during this time for most areas in West and Middle Tennessee, and over 100°F for most areas in East Tennessee. In addition to the high temperatures and heat indexes during the day, overnight low temperatures were also high. The Memphis airport weather station set a record warm low temperature of 81°F on June 30, this was also a monthly record for the warmest low temperature during the month of June at the station. Looking at the longer-term weather history for Memphis, the low of 81°F on the 30th tied the record for warmest low temperature on this date, with the last time it was recorded in the city being in 1882.





Storm Reports:

*Storm Reports are based on filtered NOAA Storm Prediction Center data or local NWS storm reports. Future quality control checks may change the official record of severe events, please see spc.noaa.gov for any updates.

There were 10 days with severe storm reports during June 2023, with 4 reported tornadoes, 117 reports of severe wind damage, and 29 reports of severe hail (with a diameter of 1" or larger). Sadly, there was 1 reported weather-related fatality, from a severe wind report on June 29, when a person was killed by a falling tree in Maury County.

CPC Outlooks for the Next Month:

The NOAA Climate Prediction Center outlooks for July show that all of Tennessee is leaning towards above normal temperatures and precipitation for the month. For temperatures there is slightly higher confidence for the southern and eastern portions of the state, and for precipitation there is slightly higher confidence in the northeastern portion of the state.
