FREE CONSULTATIONS: Every month, ASRL will offer a **free 30-minute consultation** with an ASRL faculty member, staff member, or graduate student (as appropriate). Consultations are on a first-come, first-serve basis and are limited to one consultation per research project/topic. Consultations regarding any of our services and areas of expertise are welcome. Any services provided outside of the 30-minute consultation will be fee-for-service. Prices will be determined by your research needs and a contract/MOU will be issued for services.
