To graduate with a degree in Human Services, students must earn a “C-” or better in all courses within the major and have a cumulative overall GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Please note that students seeking Child Life Certification MUST take ** courses for certification.

*** It is recommended that students take HDAL 2340 *Understanding Cultural Diversity* to help meet General Education Core requirements in Social and Behavioral Sciences. Students majoring in Human Services who do NOT take HDAL 2340 *Understanding Cultural Diversity* as partial fulfillment of their Social & Behavioral Sciences MUST take HDAL 4666 *Cultural Influences on Development*.

You must be sure to register for at least 120 credit hours, which is the minimum number of credit hours to graduate from ETSU.

Fulltime students take between 12 and 19 credit hours per semester. Overload credits must be approved by the Dean. Winter session hours count in Spring hours to determine FT or overload.

All students must take the Senior Exit Exam (CCTST). It can be scheduled at the Center for Academic Achievement in the Sherrod Library. For exceptions or online students, contact Testing Services at testing@etsu.edu or (423) 439-6708.

YOU must pass the UIT Proficiency Exam OR take CSCI 1100

(CSCI 1100 does not count for the Technology Intensive requirement for the major.)

Proficiency-Intensive Courses: You must have two (2) WI, one (1) OI, and one (1) TI from your major and/or minor. An additional two (2) WI and one (1) OI can come from your major, minor, or any other proficiency intensive courses taken at ETSU. At least two (2) WI courses must be at the 3000 or 4000 level.
