The Tennessee Afterschool network supports children, youth and families by building access to healthy and nurturing afterschool and summer learning experiences. Out-of-school-time programs give parents peace of mind, allow them to work a full schedule, and help them be more productive on the job and successful in their careers, including our essential workers. They also offer social and emotional support and enriching activities that spark kids' interest in school and learning.

Research shows that students participating in high-quality afterschool programs are less likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; are more likely to advance to the next grade and graduate from high school; earn higher grades and do better on standardized tests. Some out-of-school-time programs even provide opportunities for youth to gain employability skills, connect with local businesses, and explore possible careers.

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Every year, 103 million Americans leave \$80 billion in public benefits unclaimed. United Way is committed to ensuring that struggling families in our state are aware of the benefits for which they qualify and know how to apply for them. In response, we are launching Tennessee Benefit Kitchen, a free screener that all Tennesseans can use to determine eligibility for several tax credits and many federal, state, and local public benefits—and to access the application sites to apply for those for which they qualify.

Tennessee residents simply text “Benefits” to 211-211, and they receive a screener that takes about 5 minutes to complete. Once completed, they immediately receive notice of tax credits and benefits for which they are eligible, along with the links to apply to each benefit.

**The tax credits and benefits covered in the screener currently include:**

- Food Stamps (SNAP)
- Cash Assistance (TANF)
- Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)
- Women Infants and Children (WIC)
- Head Start
- School Meals
- Child Care Assistance
- TennCare (Medicaid, for adults and children)
- ACA (Affordable Care Act for adults and children)
- CHIP (Children's Health Insurance Program)
- County Medical Services
- Home Energy Assistance (HEAP)
- Lifeline
- Child Tax Credit
- Childcare Tax Credit
- Earned Income Tax Credit

In our first year of operation, more than 1600 Tennesseans received screenings that identified \$7.4 million in benefits!

The mission of the Middle Tennessee Council Scouting (MTC Scouting) is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values found in the Scout Oath & Law.

MTC Scouting is responsible for ensuring the success of Scouting programs in 37 Tennessee counties and Fort Campbell, Kentucky. The Middle Tennessee Council ended 2023 with 11,911 youth and 4,231 adult volunteer leaders. There were 400 different Scouting units serving youth throughout the Council. The MTC, BSA offers five viable and unique Scouting programs for youth ages 5-21:

**Cub Scouting** - coeducational, grades Kindergarten through 5 or ages 5-10 years (8,002 youth)

**Scouts BSA** - youth in grades 6 through 12 or ages 11-18 years in single gender units (3,425 youth)

**STEM Scouts** - coeducational, grades 3 through 12 or ages 8-18 years (55 youth)

**Venturing** - coeducational, between ages 14 and 21 (110 youth)

**Exploring** - coeducational, between ages 14 and 21 (319 youth)

Each of these programs use proven and tested methods of youth development with a foundation of leadership, community service, self-reliance and a duty to God and Country.
