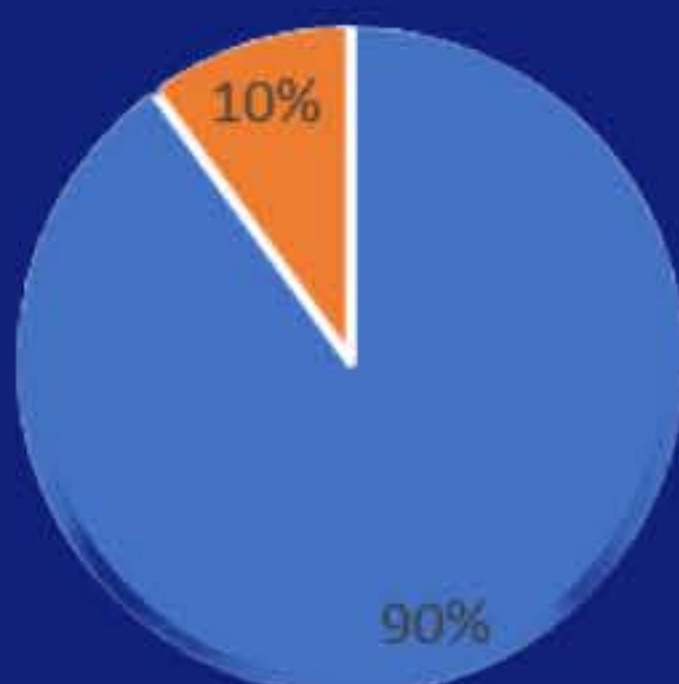


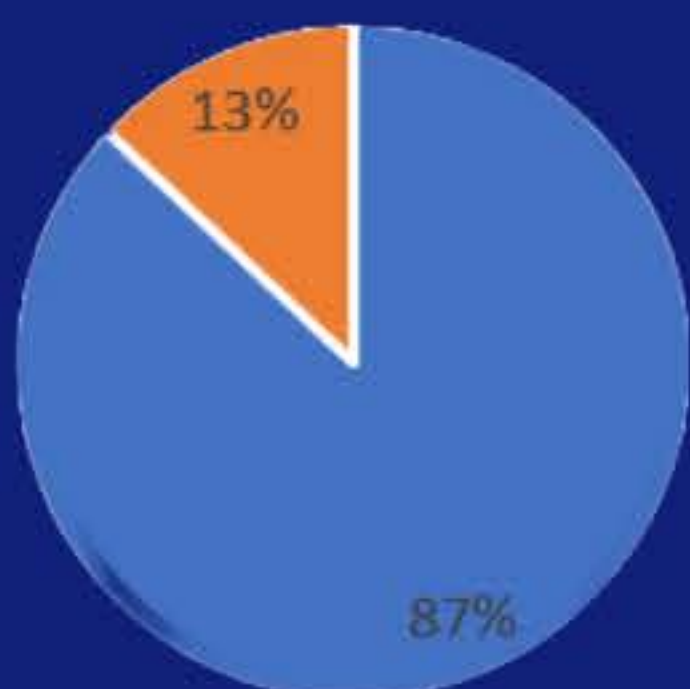
Gender Insights into RNs in Tennessee

Across all categories, females consistently represent the majority of licensed professionals, though their share has decreased over time. 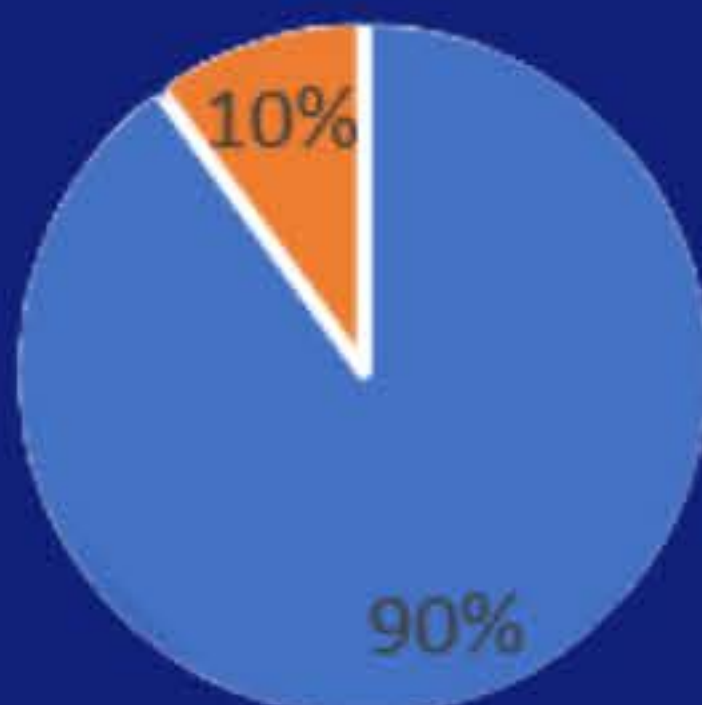
RNs - 2018 TN



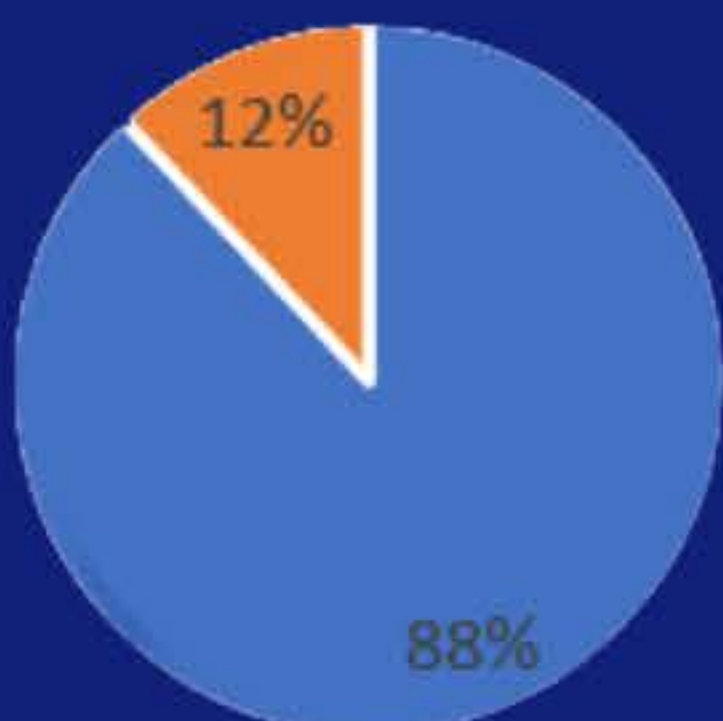
RNs - 2022 TN

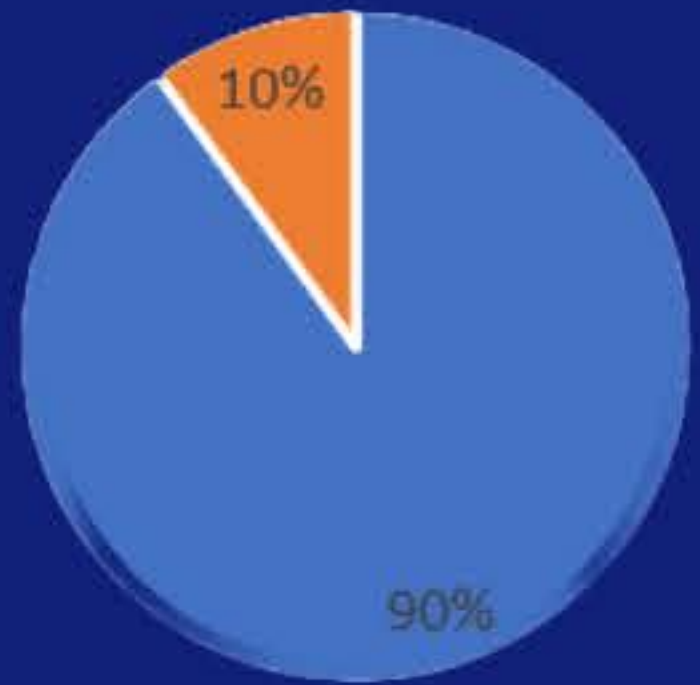

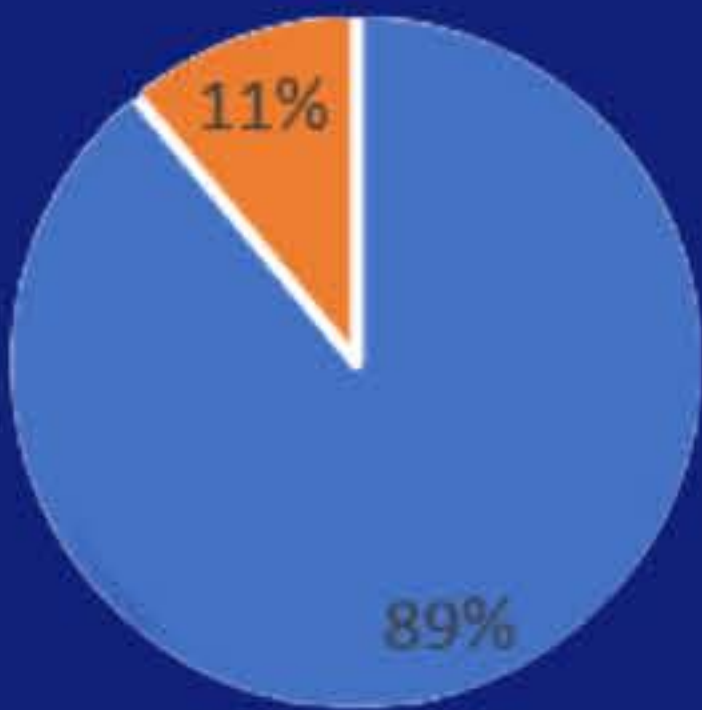
Tennessee Nurses by Gender: RNs (not APRNs)

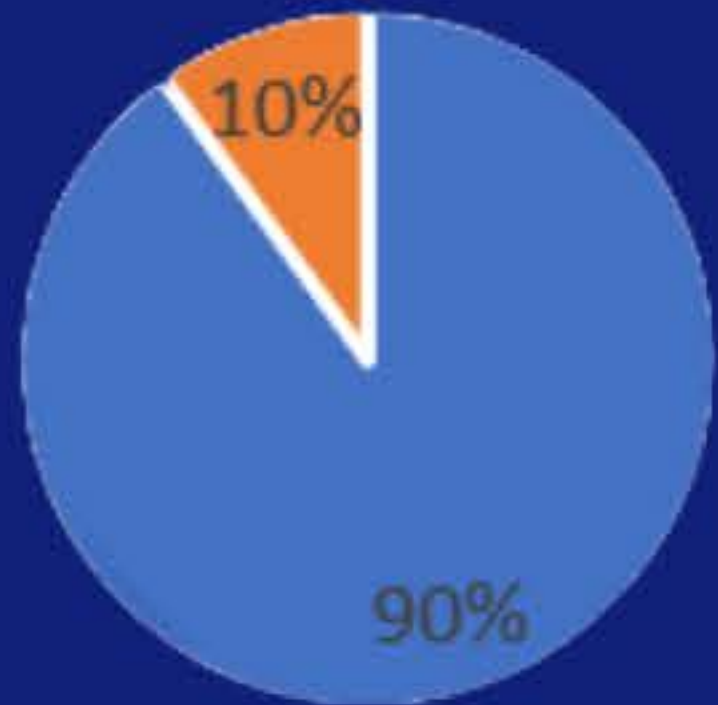
RNs (not APRNs)- 2018 TN



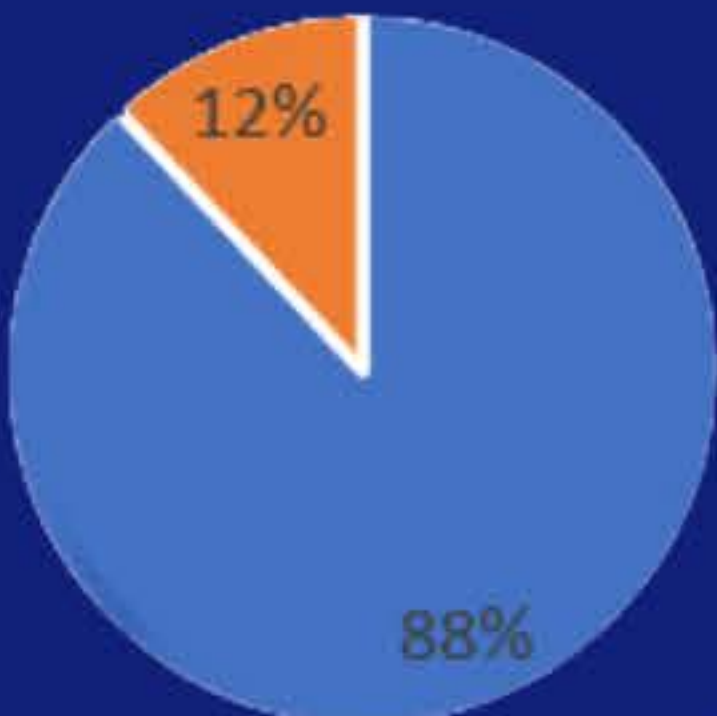
RNs (not APRNs) - 2022 TN

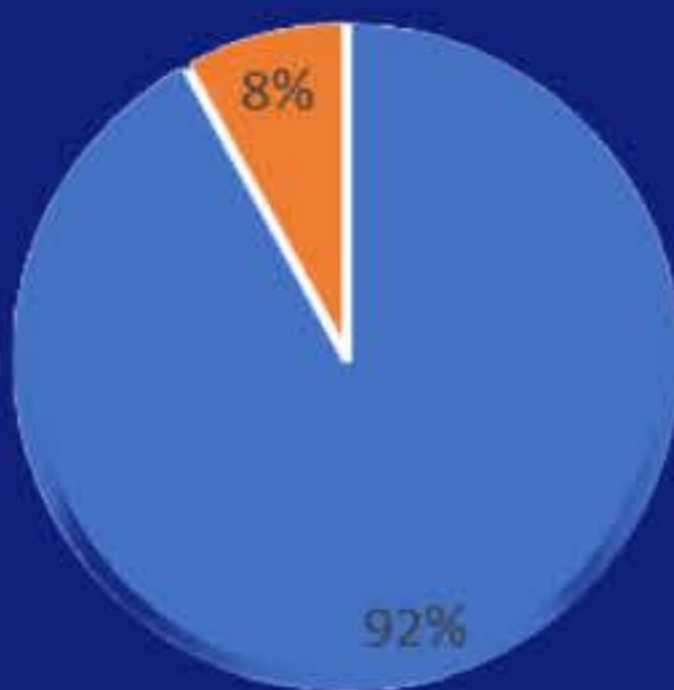

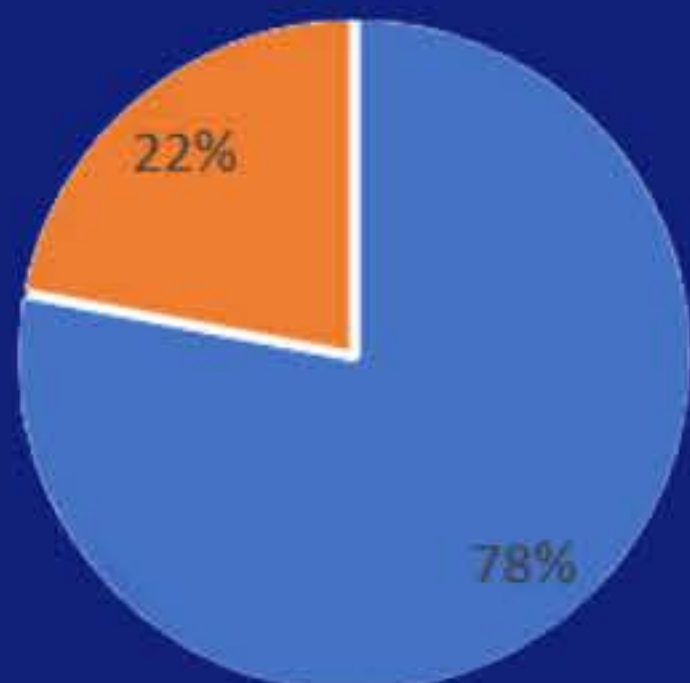
Gender Dynamics in Nursing: A Tennessee APRN Perspective

Across all categories, females consistently represent the majority of licensed professionals, though their share has decreased over time. Among licensed APRNs in Tennessee, the female proportion significantly declined from 92% to 78%, while males increased from 8% to 22%. Nationally, female APRNs fell from 89% to 85%, with males rising from 11% to 15%.

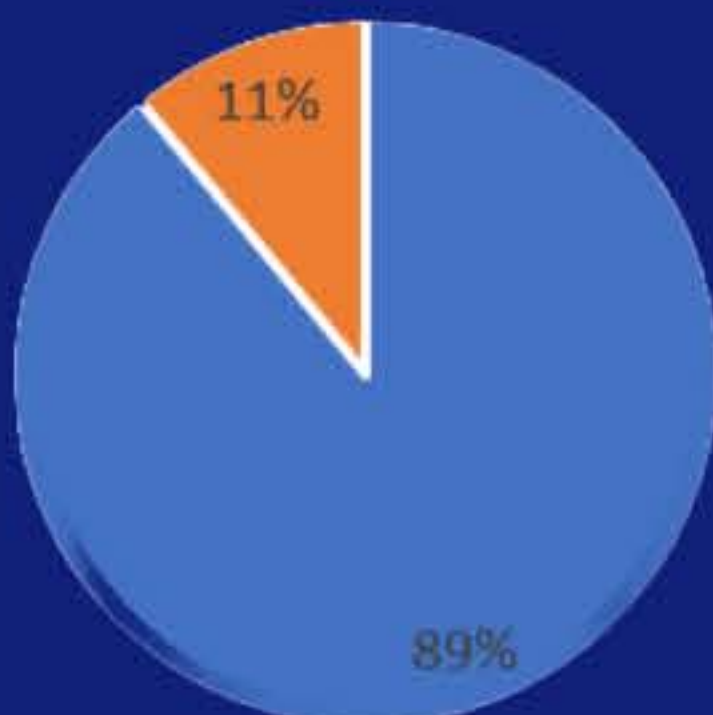
APRNs- 2018 TN



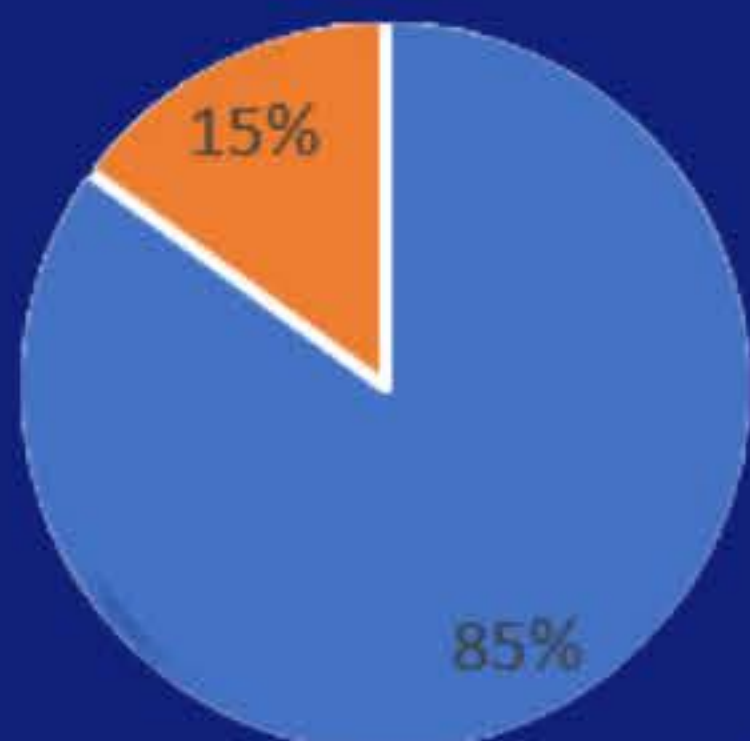
APRNs -2022 TN

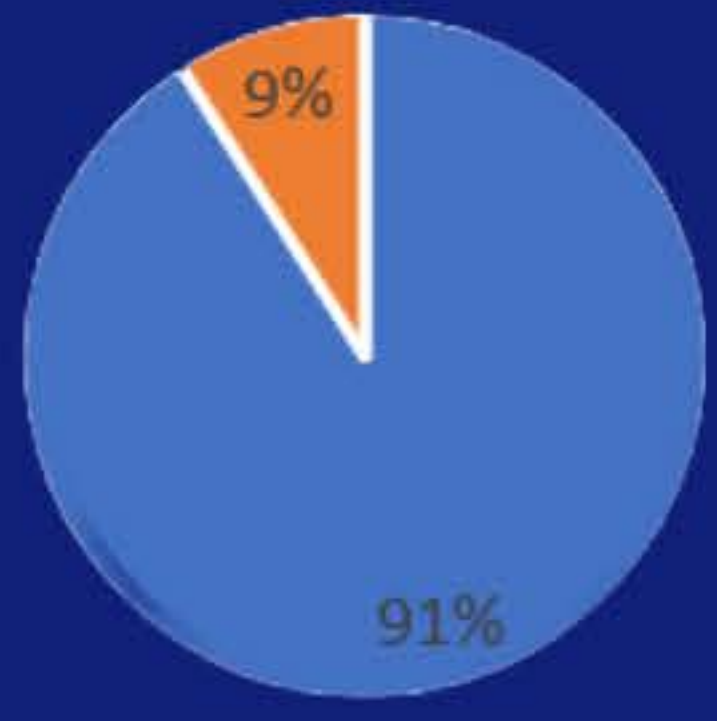

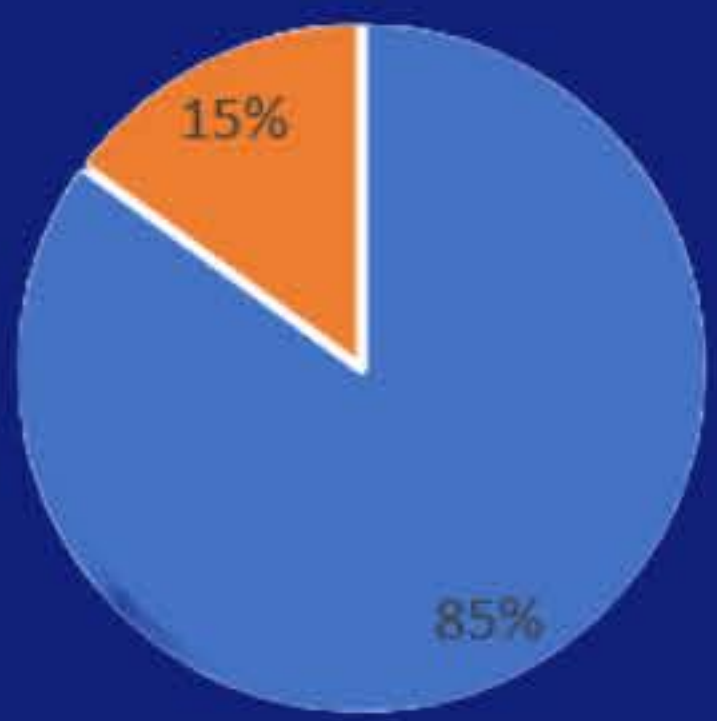
Nurses by Gender: Exploring NP Trends in Tennessee

Across all categories, females consistently represent the majority of licensed professionals, though their share has decreased over time. For licensed NPs in Tennessee, the female percentage dropped from 91% to 85%, while males grew from 9% to 15%. In the U.S., female NPs decreased from 91% to 88%, with males rising from 9% to 12%. These shifts indicate a gradual but noticeable increase in male representation in nursing roles..

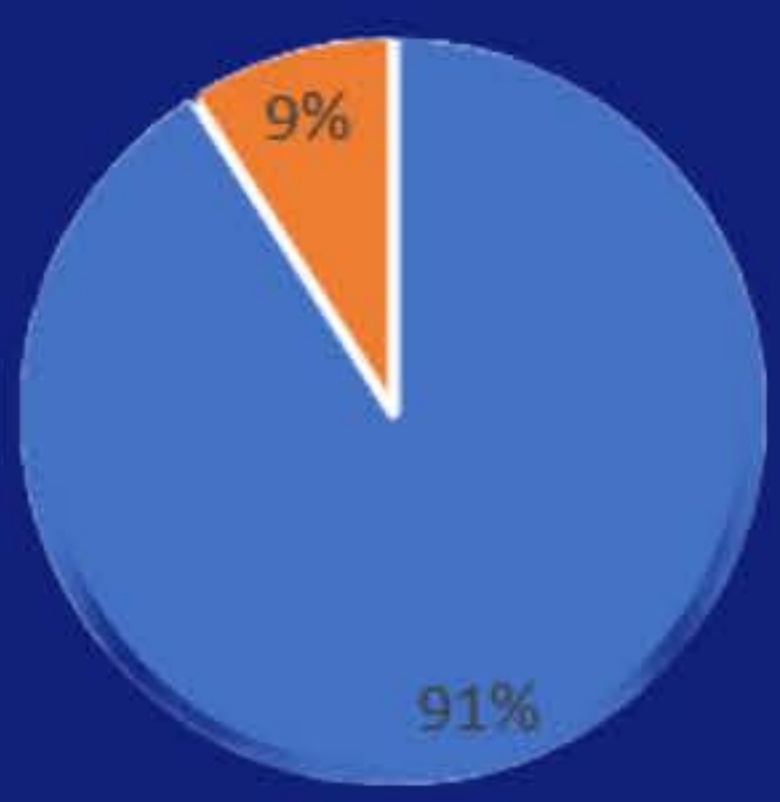
nPs- 2018 TN



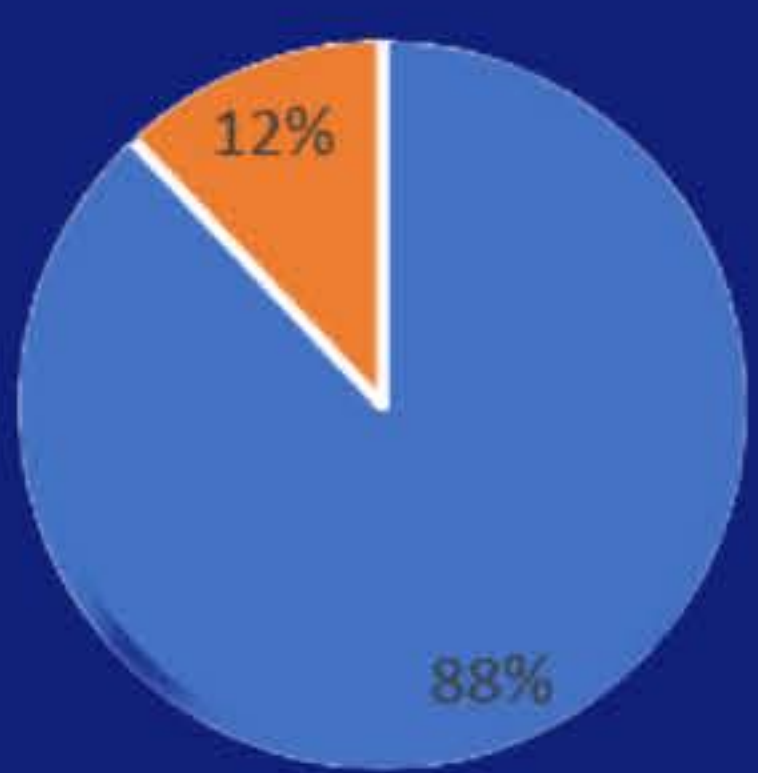
nPs -2022 TN
