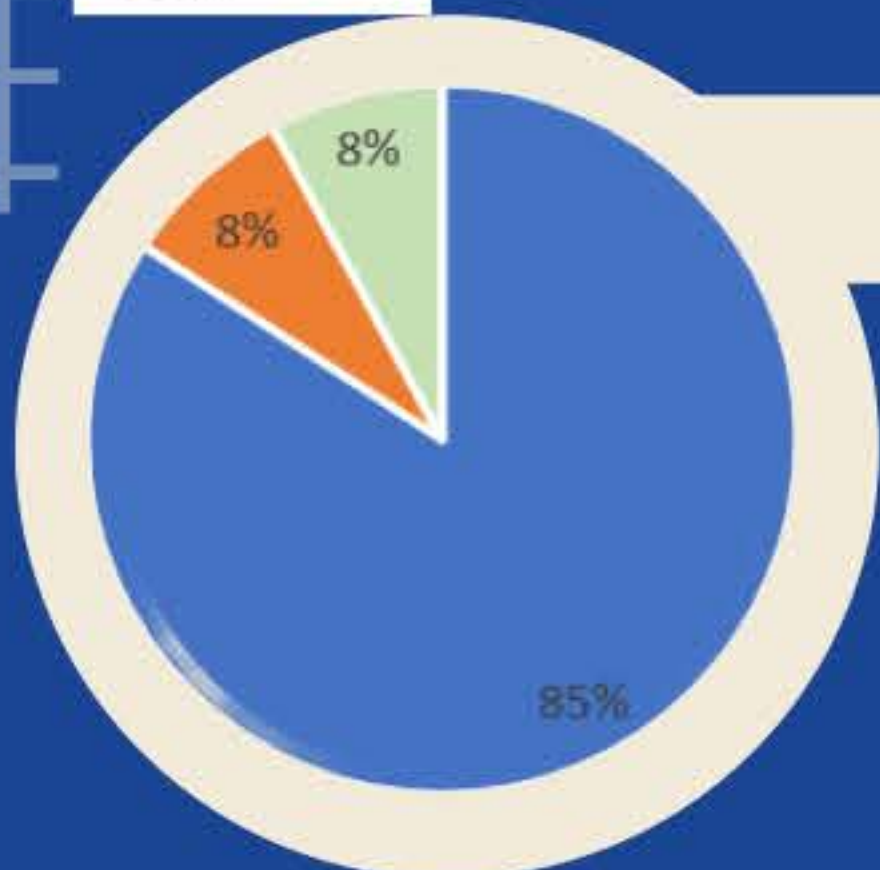


Nursing in Tennessee: A Racial and Ethnic Profile of RNs



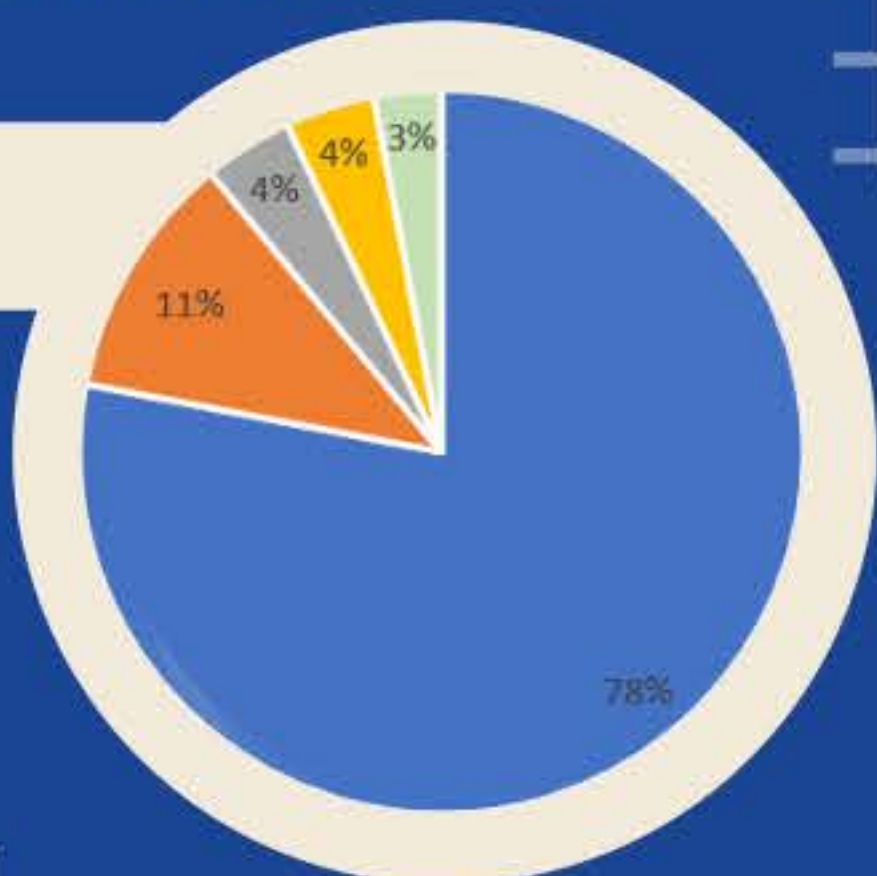
RNs - 2018 TN



The racial and ethnic composition of licensed nurses and nurse practitioners in Tennessee and the United States has shifted slightly from 2018 to 2022.

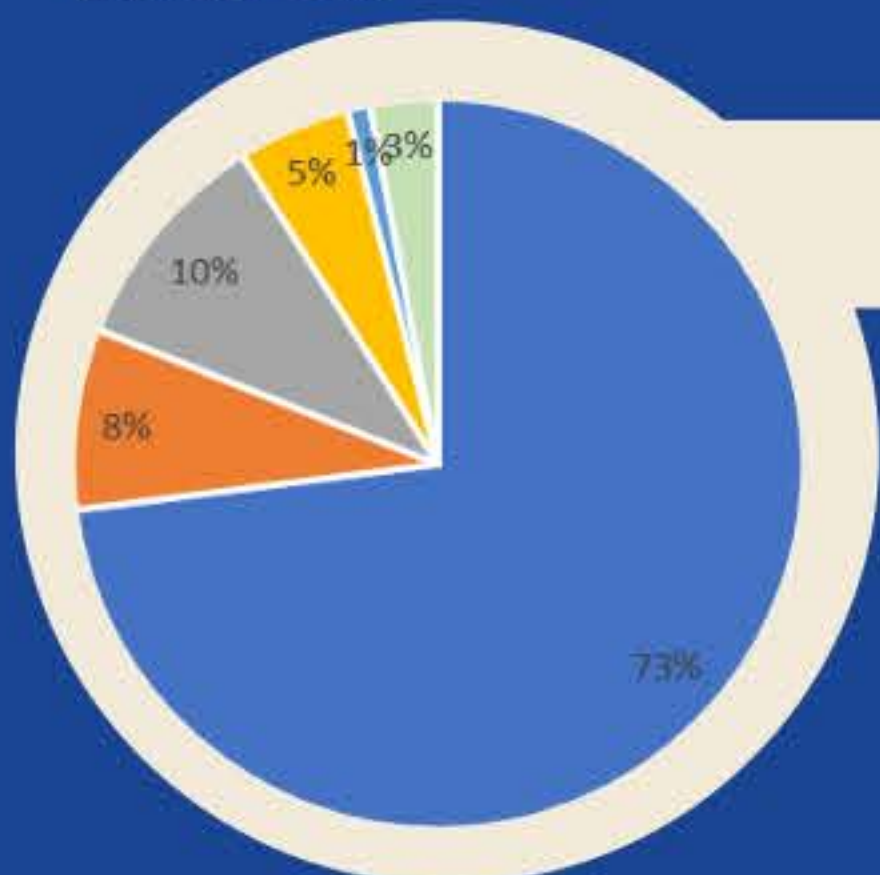
RNs - 2022 TN

In Tennessee, the proportion of White licensed RNs decreased from 85% to 78%, while the Black population increased from 8% to 11%. Hispanic and Asian populations each accounted for 4% in 2022, and "Other" decreased from 8% to 3%.



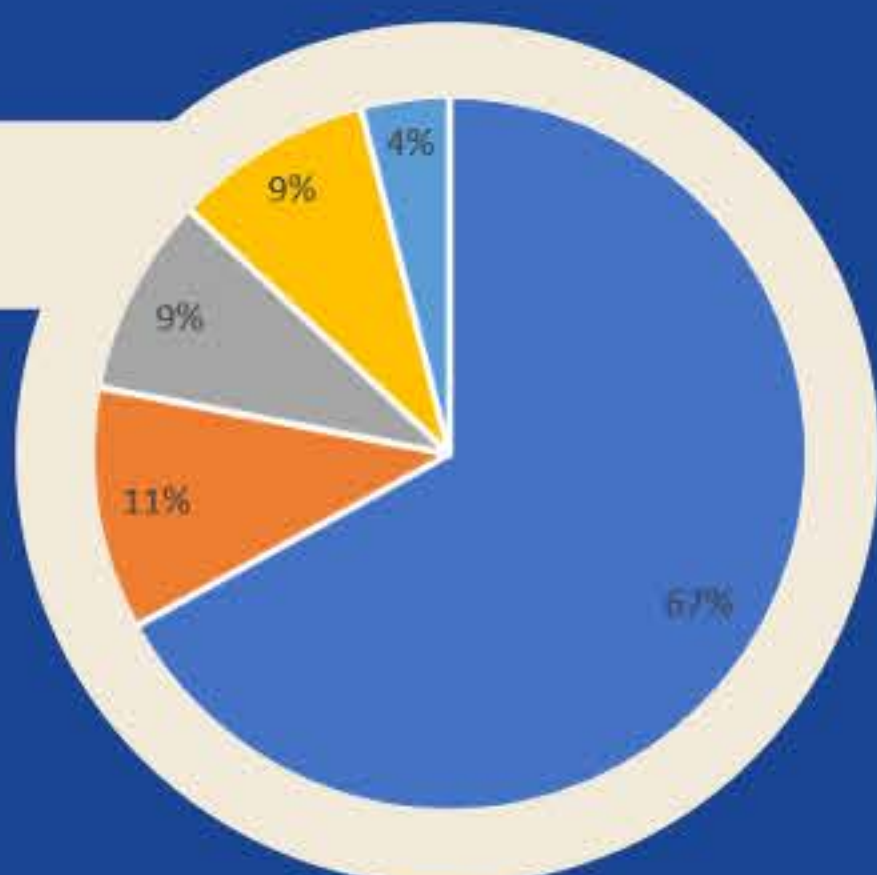
RNs - 2018 US

Nationally, White licensed RNs decreased from 73% to 67%, while Black nurses increased from 8% to 11%.

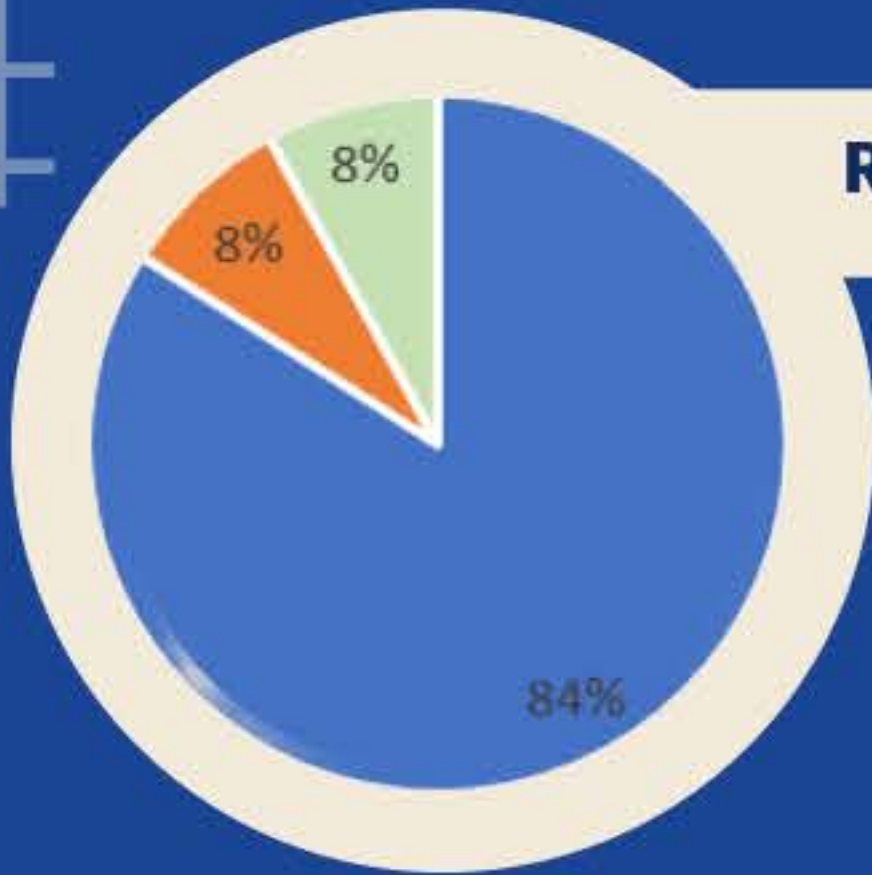
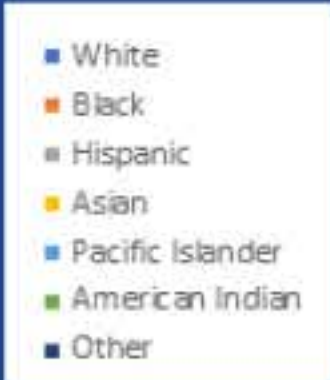


RNs - 2022 US

The Hispanic share dropped slightly from 10% to 9%, Asians rose from 5% to 9%, and Pacific Islanders increased from 1% to 4%.

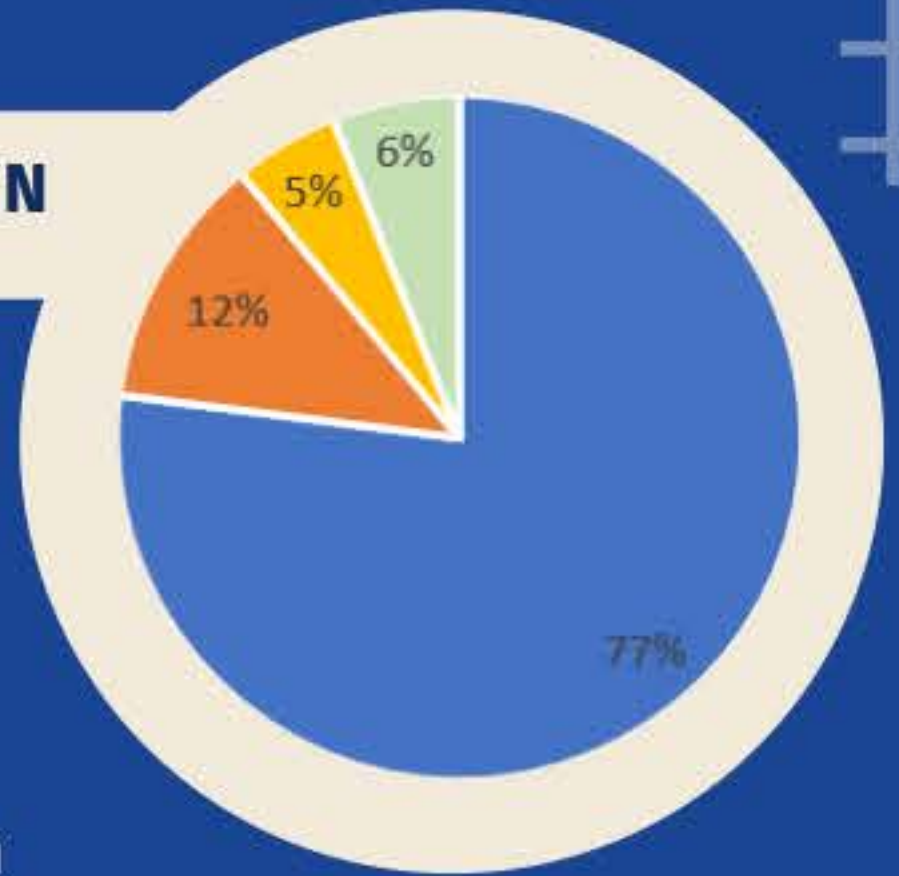


RNs (not APRNs) - 2018 TN

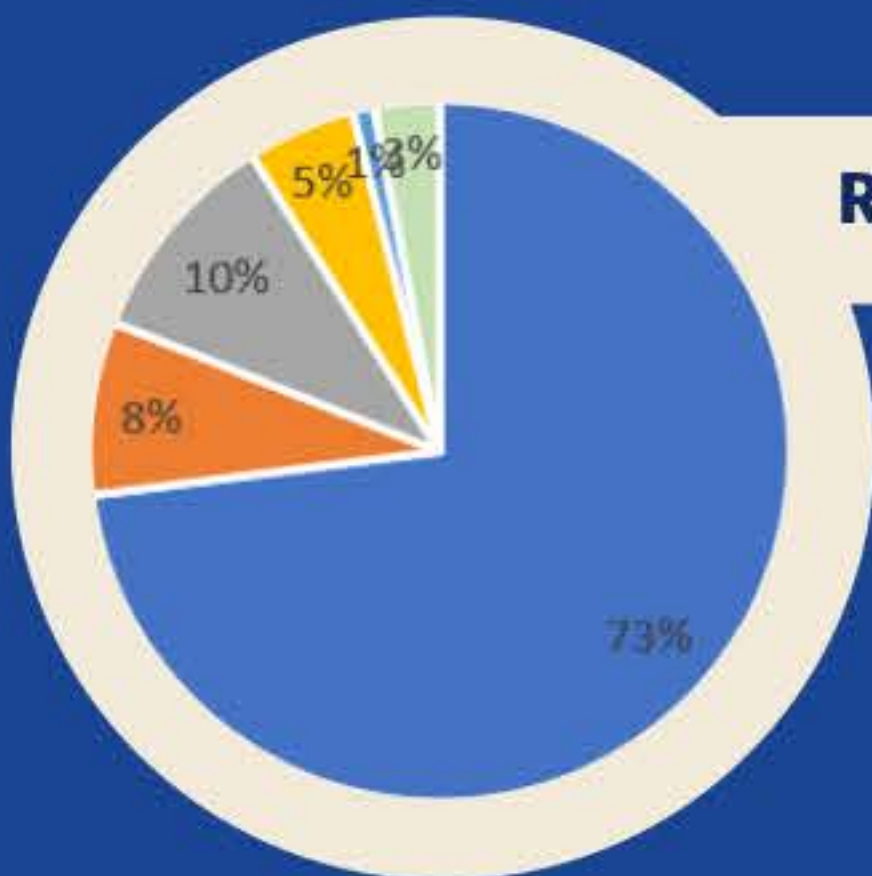
RNs (not APRNs) - 2022 TN

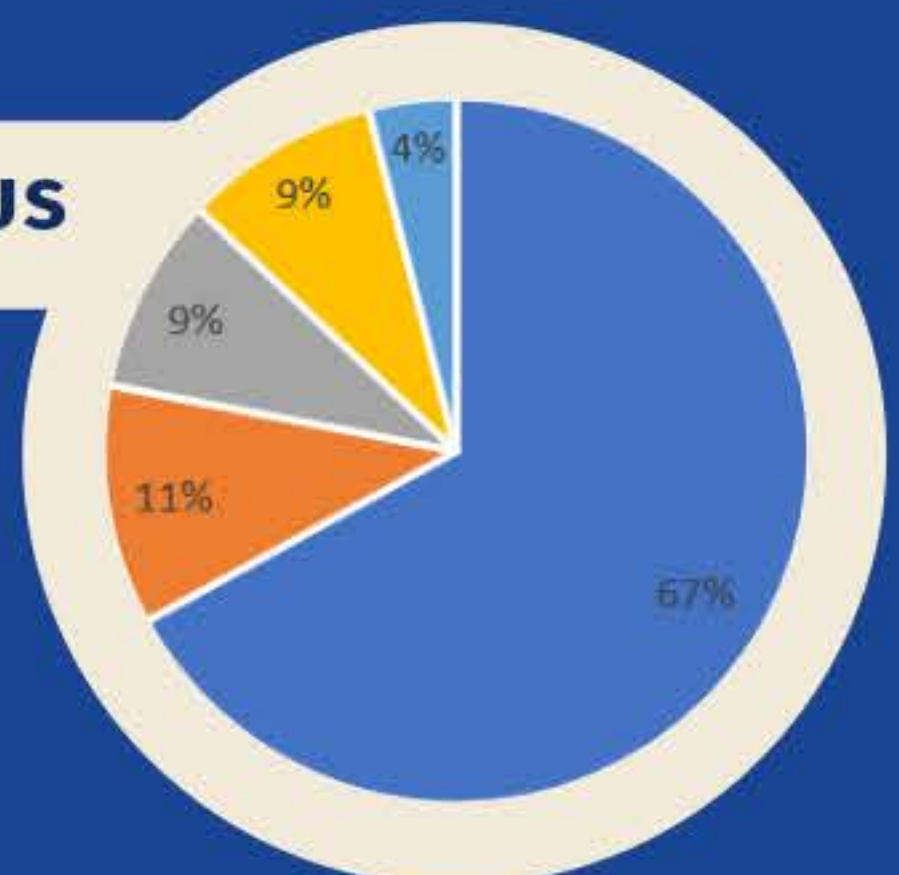

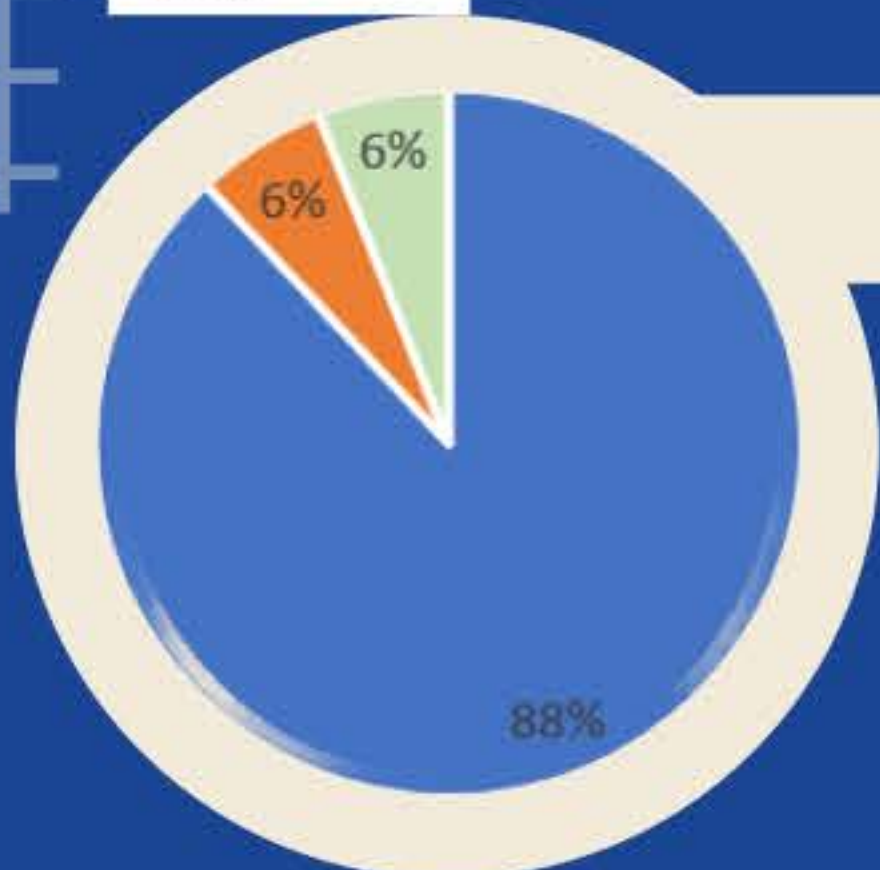

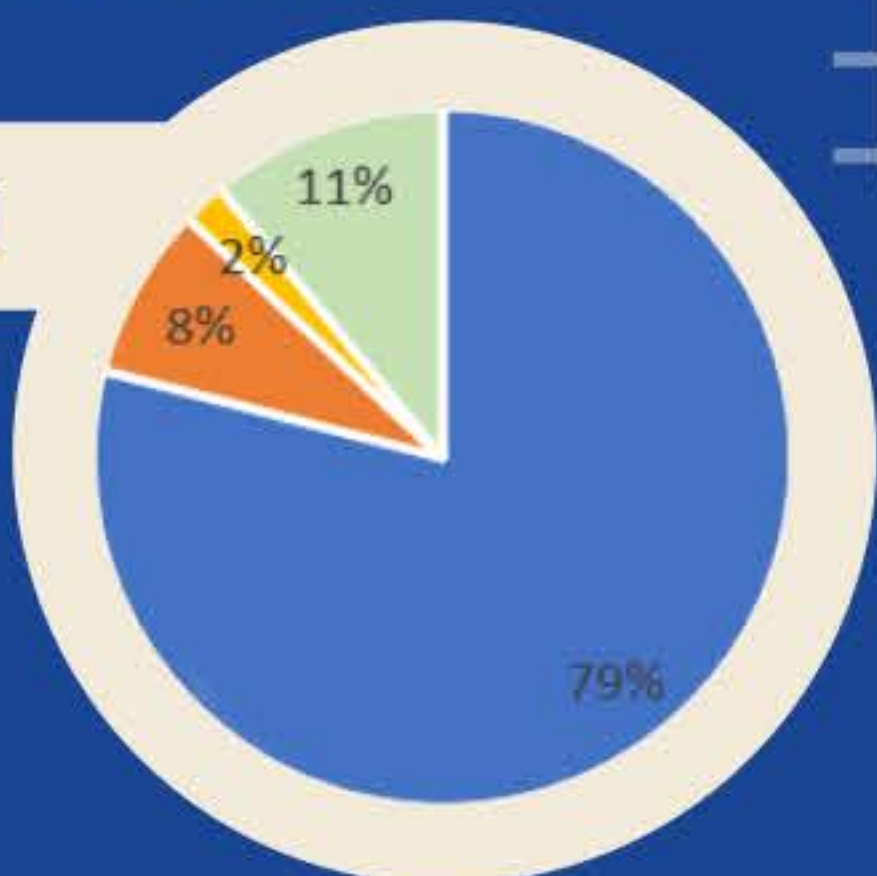


APRNs - 2018 TN

The racial and ethnic composition of licensed nurses and nurse practitioners in Tennessee and the United States has shifted slightly from 2018 to 2022.

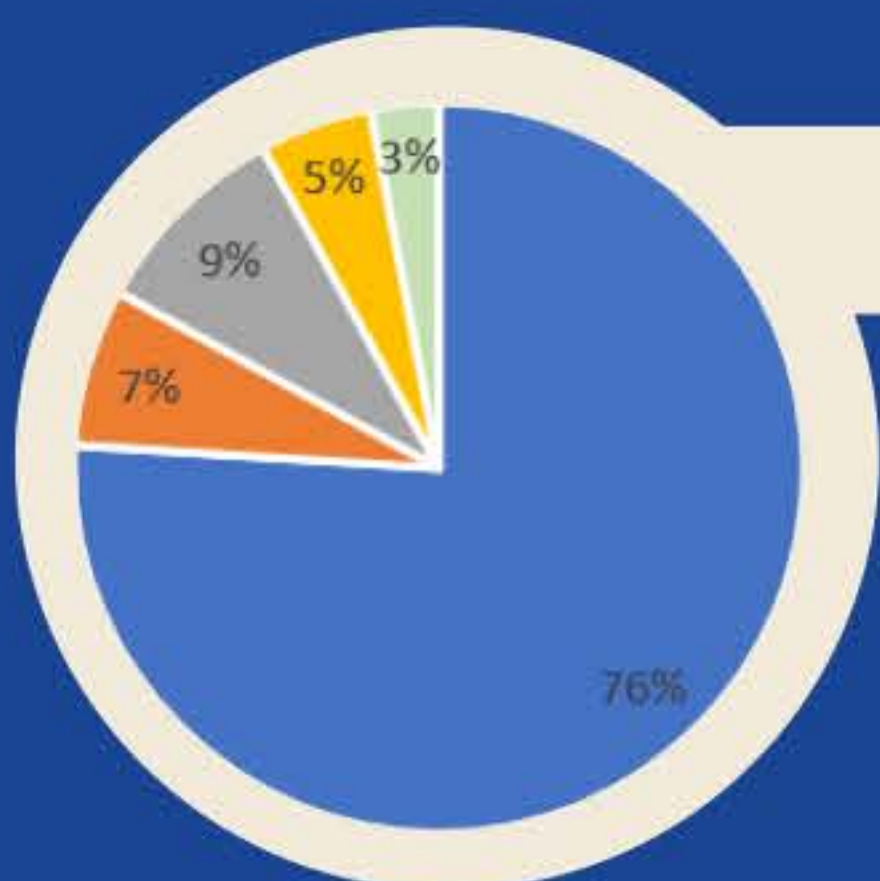
APRNs - 2022 TN

For licensed APRNs, Tennessee saw a drop in the White proportion from 88% to 79%, while Black representation rose from 6% to 8%.



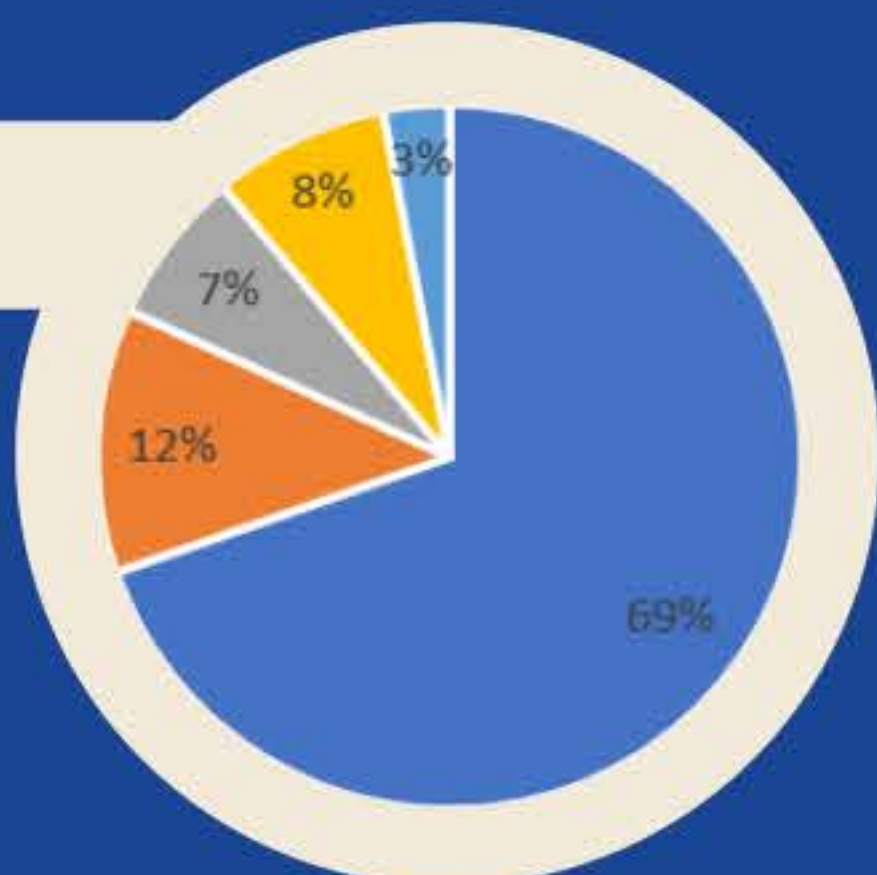
APRNs - 2018 US

The Asian population was 2% in 2022, and "Other" increased from 6% to 11%.



APRNs - 2022 US

Nationally, White APRNs declined from 76% to 69%, Black APRNs rose from 7% to 12%, and Asians increased from 5% to 8%. The Hispanic share decreased from 9% to 7%.

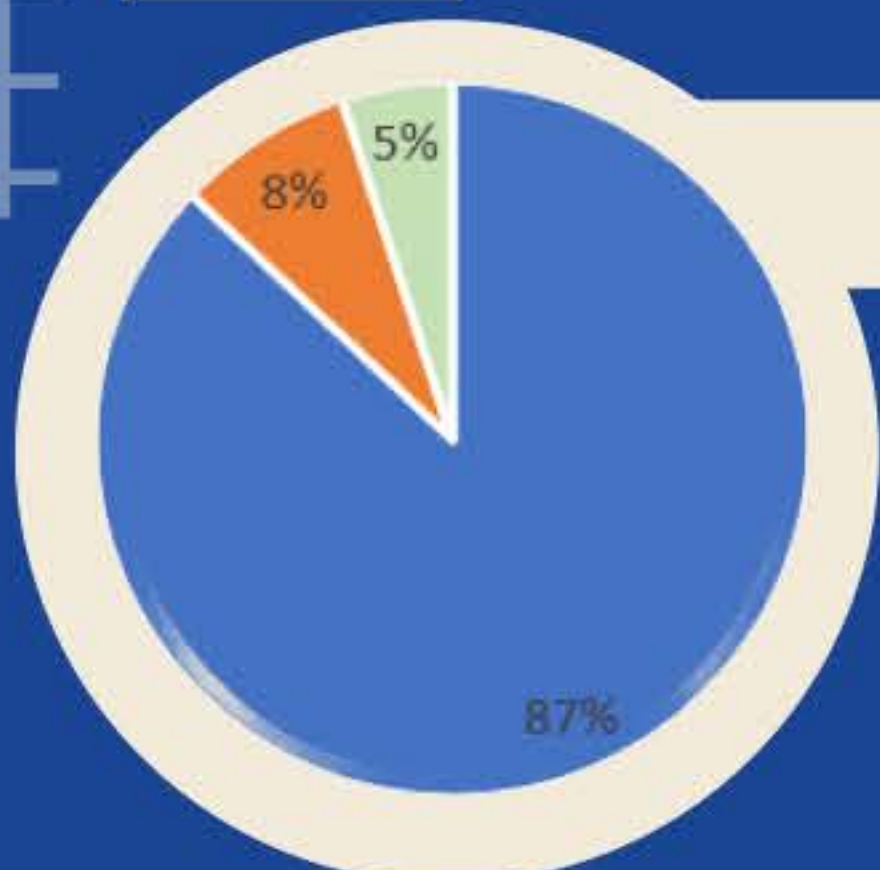

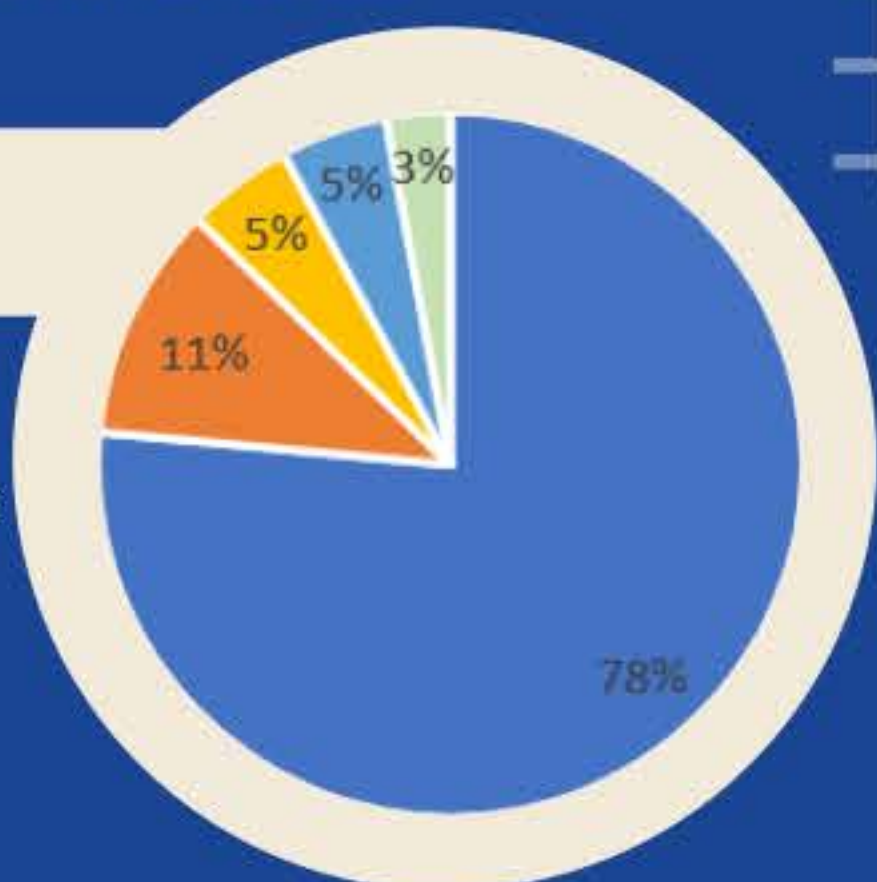
NPs- 2018 TN



The racial and ethnic composition of licensed nurses and nurse practitioners in Tennessee and the United States has shifted slightly from 2018 to 2022.

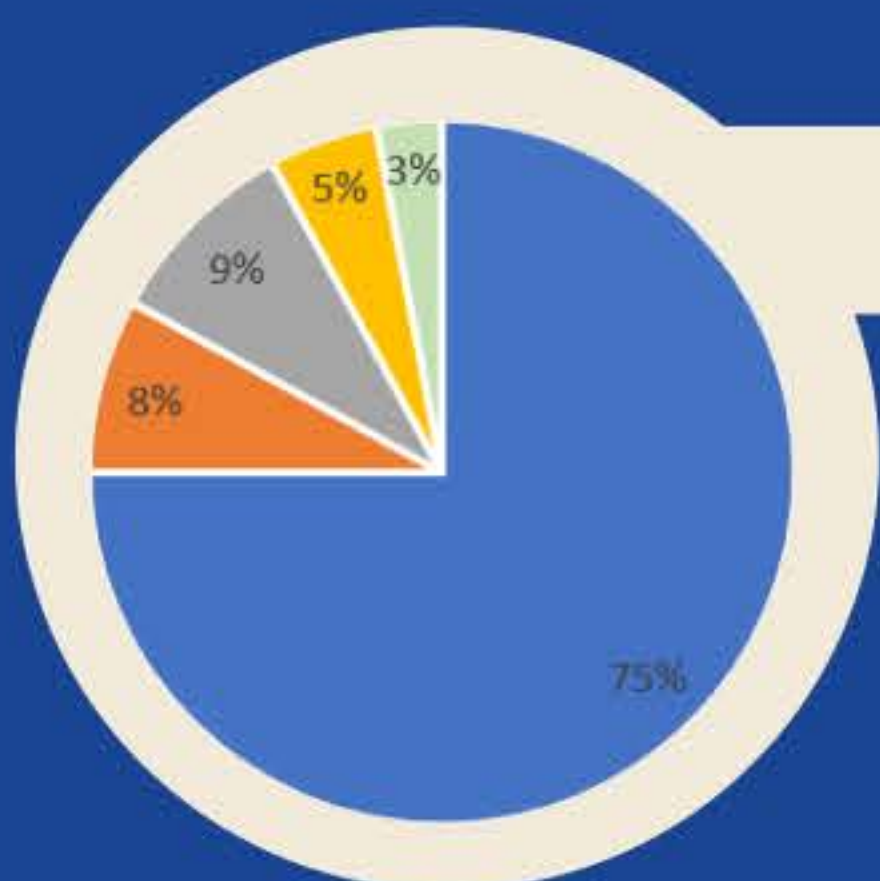
NPs- 2022 TN

Licensed NPs in Tennessee showed a decrease in White representation from 87% to 78%, with Black NPs increasing from 8% to 11%.



NPs- 2018 US

Asians and Pacific Islanders were at 5% each in 2022, and "Other" decreased from 5% to 3%.



NPs- 2022 US

Nationally, White NPs fell from 75% to 68%, Black NPs rose from 8% to 13%, and Asians increased from 5% to 8%. The Hispanic proportion dropped slightly from 9% to 8%, while Pacific Islanders accounted for 3% in 2022.
